

TRACEY LEWIS (Football Budget)

1st: Haiden Schloithe (SF) **2nd:** Kyal Horsley (Sub) **3rd:** Rory O'Brien (EF)

Hard luck story: Ashton Hams (SF). Playing his first full season back at the Bulldogs since retiring from the AFL after 39 games with West Coast, Hams claimed the Simpson Medal in this year's State game and averaged 26 disposals in 19 games. However accepting a reprimand after being charged with striking in Round 9 makes him ineligible.

CORBIN MIDDLEMAS (ABC)

1st: Haiden Schloithe (SF) 2nd: Kyal Horsley (Sub) 3rd: Rory O'Brien (EF)

Hard luck story: Luke Blackwell (CL). Recent history suggests players in a side that is well-beaten rarely poll a vote. Claremont lost five of their first seven games by more than 10 goals. That means Blackwell could well be giving up an insurmountable head start to his Medal rivals after the first block of fixtures.

DAVE LINDSAY (THE SUNDAY TIMES/ABC)

Hard luck story: Brendan Lee (EP). Sustained a finger injury in the final pre-season match which kept him out of the first six matches. Lee collected more than 20 possessions in every game and played in 12 victories so is sure to collect plenty of votes and would have been a genuine contender had he played a full season.

CLINT WHEELDON (ABC)

1st: Kyal Horsley (Sub) 2nd: Luke Blackwell (CL) 3rd: Shane Nelson (WP)

Hard luck story: Brett Hodge (PTH). Perth's best and fairest last season spent Christmas 2013 skiing. He returned to training at the start of 2014, and after feeling some pain in his hand, decided to have it checked out. It turned out he'd broken a bone while on the slopes. Pardon the pun, but it all went downhill from there. Hodge had surgery to have pins inserted. That was successful, but a trip back to the surgeon showed his hand wasn't healing as quickly as hoped. Six weeks later, not much had changed... and six weeks later the diagnosis was the same... and so on, and so on until Hodge had seen all of season 2014 slide by. The Demons are hoping he'll be right to return for the start of 2015.



Three years and 14 games with the Suns later, the 27-yearold Subiaco captain is again one of the hot favourites to win the competition's highest individual honour.

Horsley returned to the Lions den after a knee reconstruction contributed to the premature end of his AFL career. But judging by his form this season it was hard to tell.

The clever forward started his season in Round 4 as the Lions won their fourth straight game to get 2014 underway. Out to atone for last year's 8th placing, the Lions, through the likes of Horsley, made an immediate impact and spent every week of the season in the top four.

Horsley didn't go sub-20 possessions once during the home-and-

Also among the favourites, as selected by some of the Football Budget tipsters, is former Fremantle rookie Haiden Schloithe who last week won the WJ Hughes Medal as South Fremantle's fairest and best winner for 2014.

Schloithe was a major driver in the Bulldogs winning their last five games of the season after struggling to string wins together in the first half of the year.

Schloithe, like Horsley, spent the past two seasons in the AFL system, and returned to the WAFL in a full-time capacity this season full of vigour and determination.

During 2014, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

Monday night is Sandover Medal night and, with that in mind, I thought I might have a look at the various items of memorabilia relating to the WAFL's night-of-nights.

You might remember that last week I wrote about the programs/menus produced for the Sandover Medal count, the earliest I had seen dating to 1977.

But in 1982, league sponsors Marlboro went a step further by producing Sandover Medal scorecards. The large card opened out into a grid that could be used to record the votes for six players from each team. There was also space to add a couple of outsiders, just in case one of them looked like winning.

Perhaps the best of the Sandover Medal collectables, though, is the menu/program produced for a reunion of medallists, held at the Cottesloe Civic Centre in 1957.

A simple, fold-out menu, it rarely turns up for sale. However, when it does, it is often accompanied by a small cardboard Sandover Medal, which formed the table placing for each medallist.

Of course, there is also Alan East's wonderful 2006 book Sandover Medal Men, which tells the stories of each medallist to that point. And, at various times, those present at the count have also been given a keyring or a coaster to commemorate the night.

Finally, there have been several different bottles of plonk produced to celebrate various Sandover Medal Perhaps wins the best of them is the series of port produced by Sandalford Wines in 1981, 1982 and 1983. I'm not sure

whether they produced a 1984 port, but suspect they decided against it when the medal was shared by Steve Malaxos, Michael Mitchell and Peter Spencer.

Whatever the case, collectors always have an eye out for memorabilia on Sandover night.

There could be little argument about which is the greatest mark taken in WAFL history.

While some might talk about the someone like Peter Bosustow or refer specifically to Michael Mitchell's 1985 mark against Subiaco, it's just about impossible to overlook John Gerovich's grab over Ray French in the 1956 preliminary final.

After all, it's an iconic mark that sculptor Robert Hitchcock has now turned into a bronze statue that stands outside Fremantle Oval.

But I have recently been shown another bronze statue of Gero's grab. Standing just 55cm tall, it's much smaller than the Fremantle Oval version.


Unfortunately, this one has no maker's mark on it and I have no idea who made it. Strangely, the owner found it recently in an antique shop in La Trobe, Tasmania.

So, can any Budget reader shed any light on this mystery? How may were made? Who was the artist? And when was it made?

The sales turned up quite a mix of items in the past week, including quite a few grand final Budgets that sold for surprisingly good prices.

The value of grand final Budgets from the 1980s and 1990s has steadily fallen in recent years and it's usually no problem to pick them up for \$10-20 each.





But the thrill of the competition must have gotten too much for a few buyers, some of whom spent much more than that.

A Budget from the 1984 grand final sold for \$39, one from the 1989 grand final for \$25, the 1990 grand final sold for \$50.50 and two copies of the 1992 grand final sold – the first for \$25 and the second for \$17. A program from the 1972 national carnival, which was held in Perth, also fetched the surprisingly high price of \$33.

A pair of 1982 glass tumblers, featuring Subiaco and Claremont, sold for \$25 apiece, a 1985 WAFL centenary glass sold for \$5, while a lot of all eight sets of WAFL club playing cards sold for \$150.

There was also a 1960s plastic badge with the Perth logo on it, which sold for \$40, and a 1984 Subiaco annual report for \$10.

Finally, there were a few club membership badges on offer, too, though nothing like the same number or quality as those sold off last week.

A 1961 Subiaco badge sold for \$30, a 1982 Subiaco badge for \$12, a 2007 Claremont badge for \$6, a 1953 South Fremantle badge for \$62 and a 1953 East Perth badge for \$75.



Smith reaches 450-game milestone

Boundary umpire Greg Smith became the first West Australian to umpire 450 senior games when he officiated the Round 23 WAFL game between Subiaco and East Fremantle at Medibank Stadium.

Smith started umpiring in 1994 and has since umpired 159 AFL games and 291 WAFL games, including two WAFL grand finals.

His AFL career ended after the 2005 season, but he returned to the WAFL and has been a staple on the boundary ever since.

Smith said he found it hard to comprehend that he had umpired his 450th match.

"It's a strange feeling," he said.

"There's a lot of guys who have done milestones this year and when I hear someone is doing their 250th, I think 'wow, that's a lot of games' and then it hits me that I've reached 450.

"It was a year by year process when I came back. I wanted to come back because I enjoyed it and since then every year has gone by.

"I want to improve every year and the younger guys challenge me and push me. Seeing the young guys develop is really exciting. But my goals are always to improve every year."

Smith was named in the WA National Football League Umpires Association's Team of the Decade at the 60th anniversary function, the umpiring change rooms are named in his honour and he is a life member of the

AFL grand final boundary umpire Nathan Doig said Smith was an umpiring icon.

"Whenever I have a question about boundary umpiring and what I should be doing on the field, Smithy's the person I go to," he said.

WAFL Umpire Manager Darryl Sinclair congratulated Smith on reaching the milestone and described it as one of the greatest achievements he'd seen in WA


"His dedication and professionalism on and off the field has been fantastic. He has been one of the most consistent throwers going around and his decision-making is first class," he said.

THE BOXTROLLS (UNIVRESAL FILMS)

The Boxtrolls is a comedic fable that unfolds in Cheesebridge, a posh Victorian-era town obsessed with wealth, class and the stinkiest of fine cheeses.
