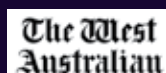

RECRUITS OF INFLUENCE

SOME of the key influencers in the WAFL this year have been recruits who have returned to their original clubs, those who have made another WAFL club their home and those who are making a Sandover Medal-contending impact in their first year in the competition.

The likes of Perth's Clint Jones, South Fremantle's Mason Shaw and East Fremantle's Brett Peake were all drawn back to the WAFL this year and have been major men of influence. Jones has had a prolific WAFL return from a 149-game career at St Kilda and a fairest and best performance at Sandringham in the VFL.

The 32-year-old leads the league in disposals (544 at an average of 34 touches a game) and has

been pivotal in lifting the Demons off the bottom of the ladder. So far this season they have won six games after only snatching two victories last year.

Jones was joined at the Demons by former Richmond ruckman Angus Graham who has also shouldered a huge workload. He is second in the league in hit outs – but is also second in frees against having given away 33 free kicks in his 14 games in 2016.

Another stand out recruit has been Claremont's Jye Bolton.

The 24-year-old former Collingwood rookie has been sublime for the Tigers. He sits fourth in the league in disposals, with performances like last week's 36-possession game allowing him to average 27 touches a game.

WAFL spreading its wings

The WAFL is hitting the road this weekend, taking a game to the country and another to an alternative suburban ground.

The coastal town of Carnarvon, in the Gascoyne region 900km north of Perth, will host its second WAFL fixture when South Fremantle and Perth clash this Saturday.

Current Bulldogs coach Todd Curley was the coach of West Perth back in 2007 when the first WAFL game was played in Carnarvon. Curley's Falcons beat the Bulldogs 7.15 (57) to 8.7 (55). This time he'll be trying to guide the Bulldogs to a victory that will help cement their top-two position as the finals approach.

South Fremantle have several players on their list who hail from the Gascoyne. One of the best small defenders in the WAFL, Adam Guglielmana is a Carnarvon product, as is former Fremantle rookie Tom Vandeleur, while Zac and Noah Strom come from Exmouth.

One of WA football's most famous Carnarvon products is Troy Cook. The Dockers' 2000 fairest and best winner played 43 games for Sydney, 126 for the Dockers and 108 for Perth.

Carnarvon is commonly recognised for its banana plantations, tropical fruits, fine seafood

and warm climate. It is situated in the heart of the Gascoyne Region on the doorstep of the Indian Ocean. It is the gateway to Australia's Ningaloo Coast, and very close proximity to the Ningaloo Reef and World Heritage areas.

Carnarvon is a very sport-minded community with every sport being catered for including touch football, soccer, cricket, basketball, netball, underwater hockey, indoor hockey and many more too numerous to mention. The Festival Grounds includes a premier football oval, netball courts, soccer fields and pavilions

This Saturday's game between Subiaco and West Perth will be the second time Kingsway has hosted a WAFL game, with the first being back in 1989 when the Falcons scored a 123 to 73 victory.

Promoted as a "community-style WAFL showdown" the event will engage with the Kingsway Junior Football Club, Kingsway Amateur Football Club and the City of Wanneroo to showcase WAFL football to the City of Wanneroo community.

The Family Fun Day will feature a comprehensive kids zone with bouncy castles, competitions, a super slide, football activities and more.

COLLECTABLES

During 2016, the Football Budget will again feature a section on WAFL memorabilia and invites you to write or email if you want more information about the football collectables you have tucked away at home.

It's not often that old carry bags turn up, which is why they are particularly popular among collectors.

Over the past few years, I have featured a few of these in this column, most of which were from the 1960s and 1970s and were very similar in design.

But perhaps more attractive to most collectors are the bags produced for state players.

Now, I highly doubt there was a different bag produced for each game, or even for each year.

In the mid-60s, WA played too many games for a different bag to be produced for each game. Take 1964, for example. WA played four games - against South Australia, Victoria and Tasmania in the east and then a home game against South Australia late in the season.

I suspect these bags were more likely produced only for special state games - those that carried some particular significance.

For instance, those that I have seen over the years include Keith Narkle's bag from the 1977 game against SA in Adelaide. That year marked 100 years of footy for the crows.

Then, there was Polly Farmer's 1958 bag. That was a national championship year (the carnivals were held every four years), so one can see why something special might be produced.

Perhaps my favourite, though, is a 1977 bag, which was produced for the players who made WA's first State of Origin team. The one in the photograph belongs to David, who scored it from one of the players many years ago.

So, the challenge is now to find other bags that are specifically for the State team in an



effort to work out how often they were made. Has anyone got one from another year?

I wonder if 1980s footballers fancied themselves as budding gourmands? Looking now at 1980s players' favourite recipes makes me think only a few of them would have known their way around the kitchen.

It was probably in the late 1970s that some bright spark first came up with the idea of making cookbooks featuring players' recipes.

The idea quickly caught on, though, and cookbooks were produced for fundraising purposes by various clubs Australia-wide. The WAFL was no exception.

Perhaps the most notable was the "Favourite Recipes of the Players of Subiaco Football Club", which looks to date to about 1986. If you are lucky (or unlucky) enough to have one of these on the shelf, you could have a go at making Mick Lee's "Shark a la Orange", Phil Scott's "Trotters with Ginger", Bevan Warner's "Hot Cauliflower with Prawns", or Bill Monaghan's "Microwave Meatloaf".

The Eagles did their own cookbook, which was produced in a similar fashion, in the early 1990s, but given this column is about WAFL Collectables, we won't go into any detail about that one.

In 1992, however, the entire footy community of WA (umpires, administrators, WAFL players and AFL players) helped with another one, which was called "Footys Favourite Foods".

One of the more interesting dishes from that book is Claremont player David Ham's "Tandoori Cashews", which simply mixed Keen's Tandoori curry powder with cashews... in a pan.

I'm also not sure Sandover Medal winner Craig Treleven's "Roast Chicken A'La Microwave" would earn him a spot on Masterchef, while Swans' Todd Hawes probably lacked a little bit of imagination in offering his recipe for "Hot Dogs" - heat a bread roll in the microwave and add a frankfurter.

In all seriousness, however, there were a couple of decent recipes in that book, which was produced to raise some much-needed money for the Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Association.

Hidden among the dozens of "Spaghettie Bolognaise" recipes, for instance, were Haydn Bunton's instructions for making a "Sambal Goreng Udang". I'll give it a shot and report back.

Finally, a reminder that collectors will have the opportunity to both add to their collection and support injured East Perth youngster Beau Chatley at today's game between the Royals and the Thunder.

Chatley was seriously injured in a tackle during a reserves game a few weeks ago and East Perth coterie group Lotons Club has made a pile of badges featuring Chatley in an effort to help the fundraising campaign that has been set up to help pay for his treatment and recovery.

Anyone who makes a donation of \$10 or more during the game at Medibank Stadium will get a badge.

Donations can be made at the club's office, or at the Lotons Club bar. Volunteers will also be walking around the ground collecting donations before the game.

Game in focus



EAST PERTH V PEEL THUNDER

After Round 12 there were some East Perth fans ready to write off their team for 2016.

It was painful enough to lose to arch-rival West Perth but the defeat left the Royals with a tough task to qualify for the finals.

Fast forward to Round 20. Jaymie Graham's men now have the chance to squeeze into a double chance in September.

But another finals aspirant, Peel, will have a large say on whether East Perth can jump into the top three.

It cannot be overlooked that some of the Royals' AFL-listed contingent have found form at the right time.

Tom Lamb, Tom Cole, Pat McGinnity and Luke Partington have been important contributors in East Perth's recent success.

However, if West Coast continues to struggle at the top level there might be an increase in movement in the selection revolving door, making it tough for Graham to settle on a winning line-up.

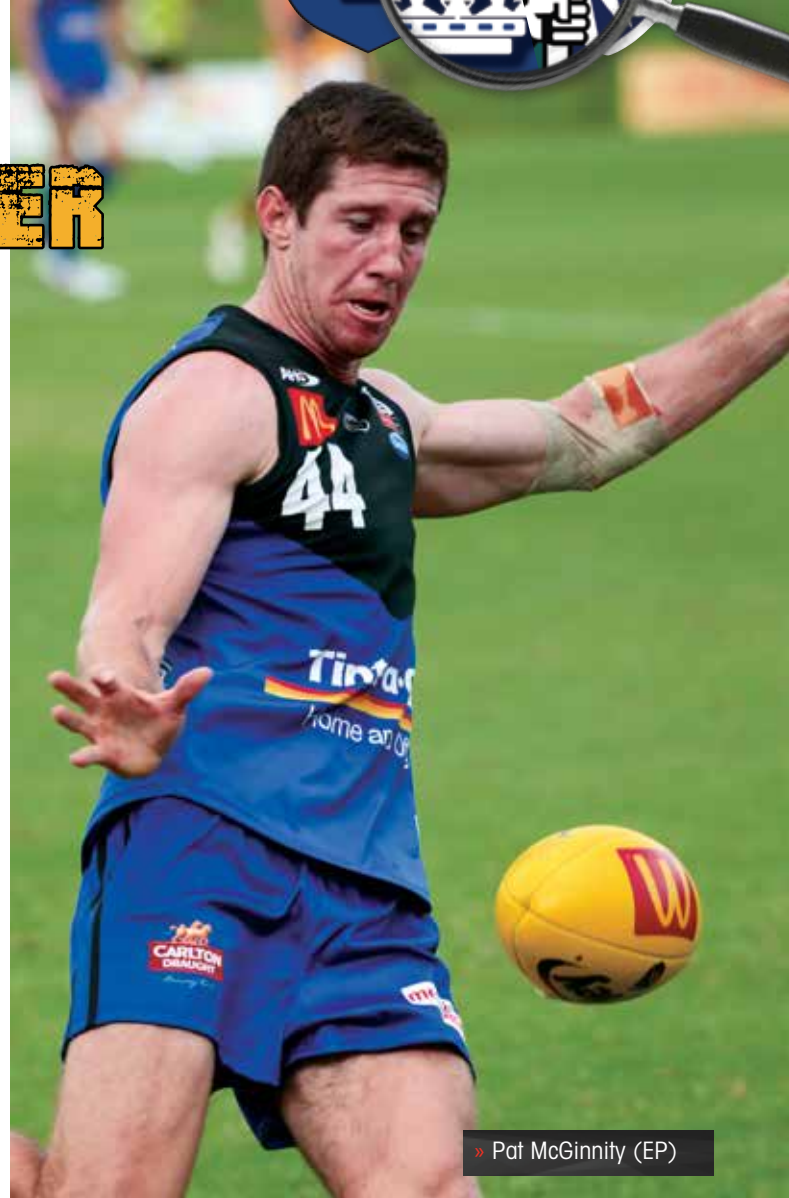
That is where ruckman Paul Johnson and defender Nathan Blee become important. Their consistently solid performances provide a solid foundation for East Perth.

In contrast the Thunder's loss to Claremont last week was disappointing considering the array of Dockers talent available. But changes are certain as Fremantle prepares for the western derby.

Michael Apeness showed he can be the key forward target the Thunder so desperately need with five goals in the loss to the Tigers.

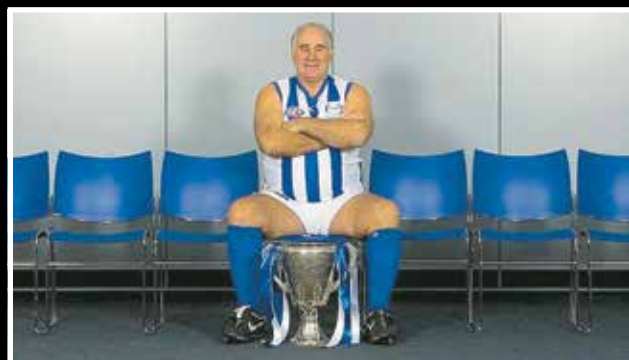

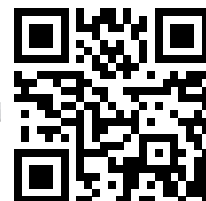
